Greetings SETA!

Springtime is on its way and that means that the General Service Conference (GSC) of Alcoholics Anonymous is drawing near also. Since my introduction to Area service 16 years ago, our April Assembly has become by far my favorite Assembly of the year. The reason for this is that we get to participate in roundtable discussions of items from the agenda for the GSC. This is one of the ways out Area chooses to inform our Delegate of the Area's conscience on agenda items that will be discussed and voted upon at the GSC. During my first time to participate in this process I became hooked. I was in awe of the fact that I, along with every other A. A. member from the Southeast Texas Area, have a voice and that voice can and will be heard. So, what is this roundtable discussion process and how does it work? Each year, our Delegate picks certain agenda items from the current slate that he or she needs our input on. These are then assigned to facilitators who prepare to lead a breakout group in discussing these topics to determine how they wish to vote on their topics. Attendees at the Assembly are randomly assigned to a breakout group or roundtable and proceed to room where the discussions and voting can take place. Each facilitator will choose a recorder who will take notes and document the votes taken. During the Sunday morning session of the Assembly, each group will report back to the full Assembly and the recorder will give the Delegate their written notes on the proceedings, thus informing the Delegate. I urge all who possibly are able, to participate in these discussions. The effectiveness of this process is directly proportional to the participation level of our members. Any A.A. member from the Area can and is encouraged to participate regardless of length of sobriety. It is not necessary to hold an elected position in the Assembly or any other entity. All members are welcome. This process only works if we participate. Grab your sponsor, your sponsees and members of your home group and come to the Doubletree Hotel Houston Intercontinental Airport on Saturday afternoon beginning at 2:00 PM. Be a part of A.A.'s future.

I was new to AA meetings in Houston but not new to AA or AA general service when I began my trek into the SETA area. My sponsor at that time Introduced me to Past Delegate Ron C. in Missouri SWAARSA but then received a message from Mo N. to look for a woman named Betsy Gerber. Mo said to find her and "hang out with her, ok honey?" I said of course because, well, it's AA and that's what we do. But, at the same time a GSR from my NETA and District wanted to introduce me to his girlfriend. Upon meeting her I began attending events with her, meeting Betsy, and seeing Ron. It seemed as if everywhere I went, Betsy was there and always had a smile.

It was soon after meeting her I needed a new sponsor in Houston and praying on it for 5 days and my Higher Power – God, saying everyday "Betsy, Betsy, Betsy, Betsy, and Betsy I got the notion maybe I had best contact her. I had some interactions with her, but I never spoke to her about much. I shared with my friend I needed contact information for Ms. Betsy G. and we set up a time to meet.

The rest, well, the rest is that I had a LOT to learn from her up until the day she passed away. She was my sponsor, my service sponsor, my friend, my guide through many difficult times ahead and the woman who never let me down to teach important lessons.



Ms. Betsy was from Virginia and Married to Mr. Marty Gerber and together raised two "beautiful and perfect daughters." She and her family moved to Texas for Mr. Marty's Career and Ms. Betsy climbed to the top of the Paralegal community in Houston receiving many accolades and awards. She was highly sought after for her incredible attention to legal details, dates, and processes. Which became her strength as well as her shine within the SETA home she found. Ms. Betsy had XYZ yrs. of continuous sobriety and served in many positions in her home district before serving as Panel 59 Delegate. While many may remember Betsy G. Past Delegate 59, or Sponsor, or Sponsee, there were many other things to know about such an incredible woman.

Betsy devoted herself to taking care of her husband Mr. Marty when he became ill and needed at home care. At home, she was a minimalist, a sports fan, a cat lover, cosmetics collector, political advocate, human rights advocate, animal advocate and a trained opera singer. She was into the arts including musical, theater and visual. She loved traveling, encouraged finding the similarities between people, ways she could connect with others, a coffee connoisseur and a great donut. She always kept Mr. Marty's family in touch with how he was doing and loved him dearly, providing him a comfortable life even with her own illnesses. She was a constant reader of something. Ms. Betsy was most proud of her Grandson Conner who had the same smile and sparkling eyes. Finally, our beloved Ms. Betsy was also a gamer once she became locked down due to the pandemic yet, still found ways to be of service. I STILL want what SHE had. A life well done and dedicated to the program that saved our lives. As the pandemic would ebb and flow, Betsy welcomed me into her home to help with the burden of costs for Drs. and hospital stays. I watched her never turn down a call and help with MANY meetings, conferences, workshops and assemblies no matter which or what technology she needed to learn. My phrase to her was ALWAYS can you slow down for me? I can't keep up and mostly she'd say, "no, put your big girl underpants on and get after it!"

Ms. Betsy Past Delegate 59, thank you for your service, friendship, and love. Your 32 yrs. of sobriety meant so much to so many, your shoes will probably never be filled, but, I have no doubt you'll be helping us all leave such a legacy.

GRAPEVINE COMMITTEE CHAIR

Introduction – My name is Darryl, and I am an alcoholic. I am happy to serve as the chair of the area Grapevine committee.

Grapevine Statement of Purpose - This committee coordinates the work of individual AA members, groups, and districts to read, subscribe to, and utilize the Grapevine and Grapevine-produced materials. It also encourages individual AA members to contribute written, digital, and audio material to the Grapevine for publication.

Past Activities – The SETA Area 67 Grapevine committee set up a display at the SETA convention in January and secured multiple Grapevine subscriptions. Also, our alternate chairperson chaired one of the marathon meetings at the convention. We gave a Grapevine presentation at District 32 business meeting on February 5, 2023. Our committee organized a Grapevine writing workshop in district 31 on February 12, 2023, at the Spring Group AA. From our last quarterly report, we got an IT liaison for the committee, which has been helpful. We have initiated an area-wide Grapevine subscription drive amongst our GVR`S, which began on March 1st and will conclude on September 30th of 2023. Also, an area GV rep assisted with the Grapevine writing workshop in District 82 on March 25, 2023. Our committee meets on the 3rd Thursday of each month at 7 pm on zoom.

Committee Future Plans – To carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers through all forms of

Grapevine media. To increase the number of subscriptions purchased in Area 67. Another objective is to support Grapevine Inc by giving our input concerning the new app that is being developed. Another of our goals is to give away more digital and audio products and to meet the needs of all of our members, which involves doing more area-wide workshops and increasing our visibility in the area. We have been getting requests for hybrid Grapevine workshops, so the committee is exploring all of the necessary equipment to make that happen. We will have a display table at the 2023 April SETA assembly and be available for questions and those who want to order a Grapevine subscription online.

Future Grapevine events – District 70 will hold a Grapevine workshop on May 20, 2023. Also, SETA Area 67 Grapevine committee will be giving a presentation at the district 60 workshop, which will be on April 22, 2023, from 12-3 pm. District 20 has asked the committee to organize a Grapevine writing workshop in the summer of 2023.
