Hello, my fellow trusted servants,

Election time always has me reflecting on my past service commitments and the journey with each of them. My sponsor always suggests that before I stand for any position, I read the job description, pray and then ask my family if they are ok with me standing for the position.

These suggestions always lead me to these questions:

- 1. Can I perform the functions of the position?
- 2. Do I have the time to perform the functions of the position?

3. What are my motives for wanting to serve?

My experience has been that when I am honest with myself my Higher Power seems to place me in the place I need to be when I need to be there. Imagine that ②.

It has also been recommended to me to read Bill's words that are on page C29 of the A.A. Service Manual Combined with Twelve Concepts for World Service. Specifically, the portion of a 1959 issue of The A.A. Grapevine titled Leadership in A.A.: Ever A Vital Need. Here is an excerpt from it:

"No society can function well without able leadership in all its levels, and A.A. can be no exception. It must be said, though, that we A.A.'s sometimes cherishes the thought that we can do without much personal leadership at all. We are apt to warp the traditional idea of "principles before personalities" around to such a point that there would be no "personality" in leadership whatever. This would imply rather faceless automatons trying to please everybody, regardless.

At other times we are quite as apt to demand that A.A.'s leaders must necessarily be people of the most sterling judgment, morals, and inspirations; big doers, prime examples of all, and practically infallible.

Real leadership, of course, must function in between these entirely imaginary poles of hoped-for excellence. In A.A. certainly no leader is faceless, and neither is any leader perfect. Fortunately, our Society is blessed with any amount of real leadership—the active people of today and the potential leaders of tomorrow as each new generation of able members swarms in. We have an abundance of men and women whose dedication, stability, vision, and special skills make them capable of dealing with every possible service assignment. We have only to seek these folks out and trust them to serve us.

Somewhere in our literature there is a statement to this effect: "Our leaders do not drive by mandate; they lead by example." In effect, we are saving to them, "Act for us, but don't boss us."

A leader in A.A. service is therefore a man (or woman) who can personally put principles, plans and policies into such dedicated and effective action that the rest of us want to back him up and help him with his job. When a leader power-drives us badly, we rebel; but when he too meekly becomes an order-taker and he exercises no judgment of his own—well, he really isn't a leader at all.

Good leadership originates plans, policies, and ideas for the improvement of our Fellowship and its services. But in new and important matters, it will nevertheless consult widely before taking decisions and actions. Good leadership will also remember that a fine plan or idea can come from anybody, anywhere. Consequently, good leadership will often discard its own cherished plans for others that are better, and it will give credit to the source.

Good leadership never passes the buck. Once assured that it has, or can, obtain sufficient general backing, it freely takes decisions and puts them into action forthwith, provided of course that such actions be within the framework of its defined authority and responsibility"

I am so grateful that I have been given the opportunity to serve as your Alt-Delegate panel 73 Area 67. It has been one of my favorite positions y'all have allowed me to serve in. To be able to travel around the Area and visit with all the Districts. I am excited to see where my Higher Power wants me next.

Future Grapevine Events -We are working with districts 52 & 80 on Grapevine writing workshops and presentations in the area. In January, the GV committee has been asked to give a workshop at the 2025 SETA Convention. Also, the GV committee has been asked to provide a workshop in District 33 at their annual "Unity Conference" event in 2025. SETA Area 67 GV has been asked to set up a display table at the 2025 Texas State AA Convention in Houston, Texas. If any group or district is interested in hosting a Grapevine writing workshop or presentation in 2024, please get in touch with anyone on our committee. All the workshops we have had so far have been inspiring and informative. Something begins to happen when we start writing about any subject related to alcoholism.

Thank you all for allowing me to serve.



July 2024 Unapproved Assembly Minutes






