Total receipts were \$45.00, total expenditures were \$655.00, a negative cash flow for the month of \$605.00. The ending checking account balance is \$6,219.20 less our prudent reserve of \$1,875.00. We have a balance of \$4,344.20 going into 2023. However, we have increased budget to \$8,100 (was \$7,300) so we need to be mindful as the year continues. We are hopeful that group donations will increase as well. *From Eddie, "A big thank you for allowing and trusting me to be the D31 Treasurer for the past two years, it was my pleasure serving you."*

Welcome to a New Year and new rotation. I am excited to see what we can accomplish this year. I was fortunate to attend 2023 Annual SETA Convention and first Quarter Area Assembly. Of note:

- Rick M, our new delegate assigned to CPC committee
- Cost of AA literature will increase by 10% soon to offset rising prices
- Jacketed and non-jacketed Big Books soon to be available. (Non-jacketed books were produced to get around the supply issue with paper.)
- Plain Language version of the BB will be available to the entire conference for review and access limited (kept under lock/key) to protect AA copyrights.
- Experience, Strength, Hope Spanish translation is free and available at www.aa.org
- Contributions to GSO have finally reached PRE-Covid levels.
- GSO received over 2800 story submissions for Version 5 of the BB
- GSO Conference Agenda will be available sometime in February for district discussion and we can decide what items we would like to have discussed at groups so we can make comments to our delegate and his vote will represent our district's conscience.
