TRADITION 7 (LONG FORM) The AA groups themselves ought to be fully supported by the voluntary contributions of their own members. We think that each group should soon achieve this ideal; that any public solicitation of funds using the name of AA is highly dangerous, whether by groups, clubs, hospitals, or other outside agencies; that acceptance of large gifts from any source, or of contributions carrying any obligation whatever, is unwise. Then, too, we view with much concern those AA treasuries which continue, beyond prudent reserves, to accumulate funds for not state AA purpose. Experience has often warned us that nothing can so surely destroy our spiritual heritage as futile disputes over property, money, and authority.

<u>CONCEPT 7</u> (SHORT FORM): The Conference recognizes that the Charter and the Bylaws of the General Service Board are legal instruments: that the Trustees are thereby full empowered to manage and conduct all of the world service affairs of AA.
