By the time this reaches you through our newsletter, Christmas and New Years will have passed. Hopefully we connected at the SETA Convention.

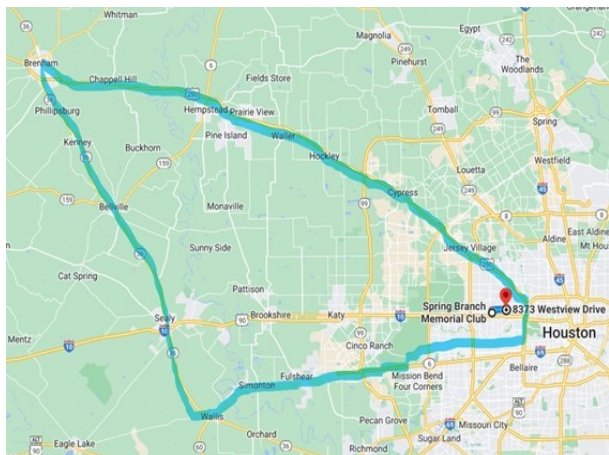

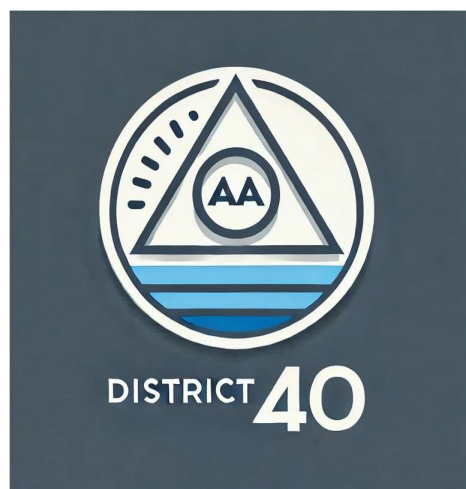

I am deeply grateful for the opportunity to serve as your Alternate DCM. I have great respect for our DCM, Mike, and I look forward to working closely with him over the next two years.

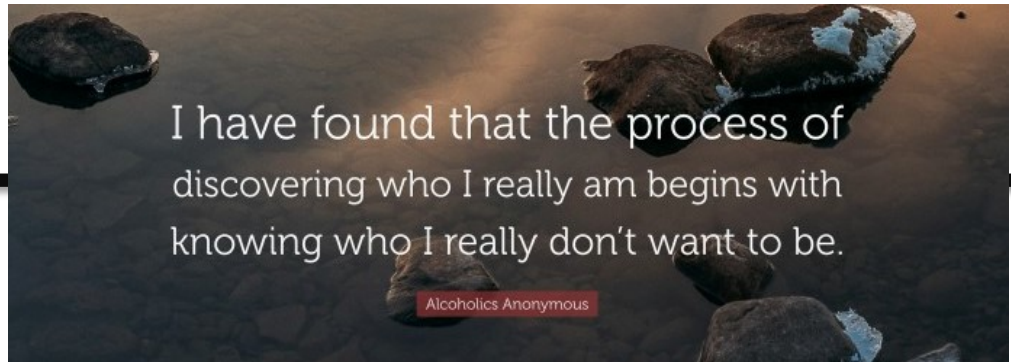
