What Does "Conference -Approved Literature" Mean?



You hear it in meetings when someone reads from 24 Hours A Day or The Sermon on the Mount ... "You can't read that – it's not AA approved literature." You hear it in group conscience meetings..."We should only allow AA approved literature."

Actually, there is no such thing as "AA Approved Literature".

The term "Conference-Approved" identifies written or audiovisual material solely owned and published by AAWS. Conference-approved material always deals with the recovery program of Alcoholics Anonymous or with information about the A.A. Fellowship.

It does NOT mean the Conference disapproves of any other publications.

There is a great deal of literature helpful to alcoholics published by others, and A.A. does not try to tell any individual member what he or she may or may not read.

Conference approval assures us that a piece of literature represents solid A.A. experience. Any Conference-approved book, pamphlet or video goes through a lengthy and painstaking process, during which a variety of A.A.s from all over the United States and Canada read and express opinions at every stage of production. This process assures that everything in such literature is in accord with A.A. principles. The term has no relation to material not published by AAWS. Any literature that pertains to the principles of AA or is approved by a Group Conscience is perfectly acceptable to read by any AA member or in any AA meeting. AA as a whole does not oppose these choices.
