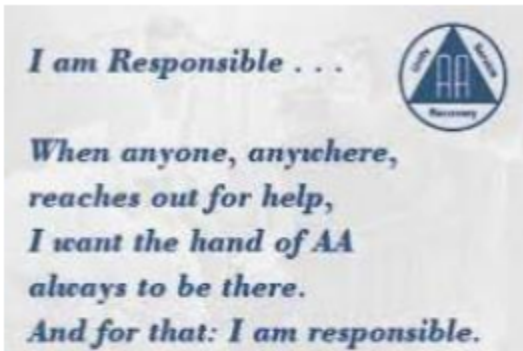

The AA Responsibility Pledge is a service piece that, unfortunately, is sometimes taken out of context or misunderstood.

It was introduced at the 1965 General Service Conference and adopted at the 1966 GSC. When the AA fellowship finally took responsibility for our Third Legacy service structure we switched from 14 non-alcoholic trustees and 7 alcoholic trustees on the AA General Service Board to our current compilation of 14 alcoholic trustees and 7 non-alcoholic. We thus became responsible for our own society's future service structure. Beautiful! So what does this service piece speak to?

It's simply a reminder that we all take part in creating and preserving the protective mantle which covers AA as a whole. This ensures the future of AA for the "alcoholic not yet born". We do this by supporting District, Area, Regional and GSO service arms, and by learning all we can about our Traditions, Concepts and history.

Of course, reaching out to the alcoholic who comes through the door to their first meeting is crucial, but THIS declaration speaks to the preservation of our Fellowship for future generations. And for that: I am responsible.
