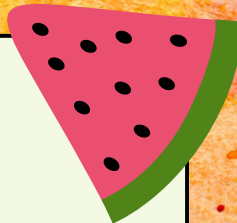

Step 7: Humbly asked him to remove our shortcomings.

When we reach Step 7, "Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings", we are being asked to do something completely against our old nature: surrender control. For a lot of us, "humility" used to seem like a punishment or weakness. In recovery, we learn it is simply a clear-eyed look at the truth of who we are, with all of our strengths and flaws. We learn to stop trying to manage our own personality transformation, or white-knuckle our character defects into submission. Instead, Step 7 teaches us to step aside, let go, and trust that a Power greater than ourselves can do a much better job of molding our character than we ever could. We might not ever be perfect, but we can be teachable.

Tradition 7: Every A.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.

In plain english: If you want AA to stay available for you, and for the next person walking through those doors shivering in July, we gotta cough up some cash. Your group's gotta pay rent to the club, and the entities need donations to operate.

If every individual member donated \$5.16 **once per YEAR** to GSO, it would be completely self sustaining.
