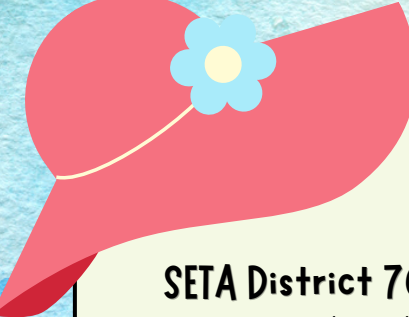

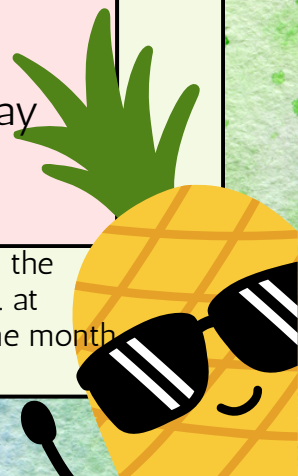

Step 8: Humbly asked him to remove our shortcomings.

When we reach Step 8, "Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all," we are asked to begin the work of relational healing. Notice that Step 8 does not ask us to run out and make amends *yet*, that's Step 9. Step 8 is purely about reflection, honesty, and preparation. For many of us, looking at past wreckage brings up heavy guilt, defensiveness, or fear. We learn to set aside our pride, stop keeping score of who hurt us first, and focus entirely on where we caused harm. Step 8 teaches us that willingness is the key: we simply open our minds to the possibility of repair, trusting that taking responsibility for our part clears the way for freedom and peace.

Tradition 8: Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever non-professional, but our service centers may employ special workers.

AA doesn't sell recovery, charge fees, or employ professional 12-step counselors.

When one alcoholic helps another, it must always be done freely from the heart. However, running a service office, answering phones, or mailing literature requires full-time administrative work, and those workers deserve fair pay for their labor.

Tradition 8 keeps the heart of AA voluntary and personal while ensuring the practical, day-to-day operations run smoothly.
