

District 81 Committee Meeting Minutes
November 2, 2022

Call to Order: Keith – Serenity Prayer

Traditions/Concept: Concept 11 read by Lynn

The meeting was called to order at 7 pm by Keith with the Serenity Prayer.

Roll Call: 37 attendees with 32 voting members

Keith called the meeting to order. Concept 11 was read by Lynn. Cindy performed the roll call. There were 37 attendees with 32 voting members. The meeting minutes for October 2022 were presented. Committee Reports:

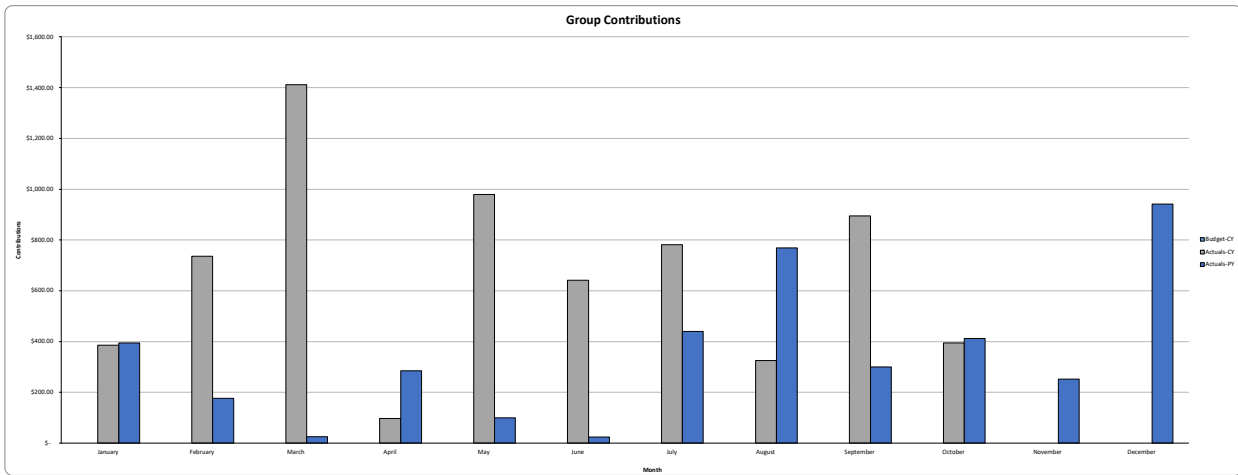

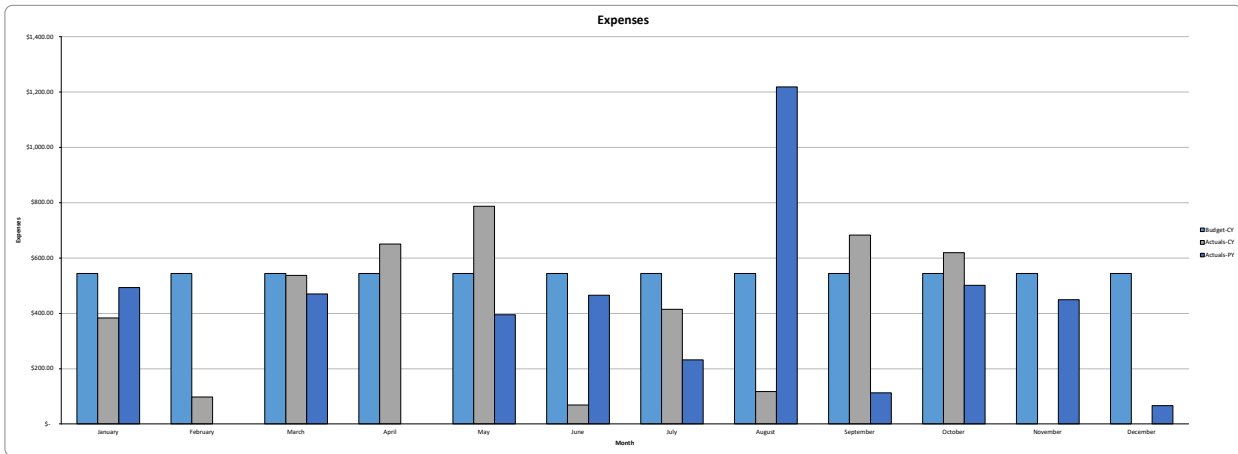

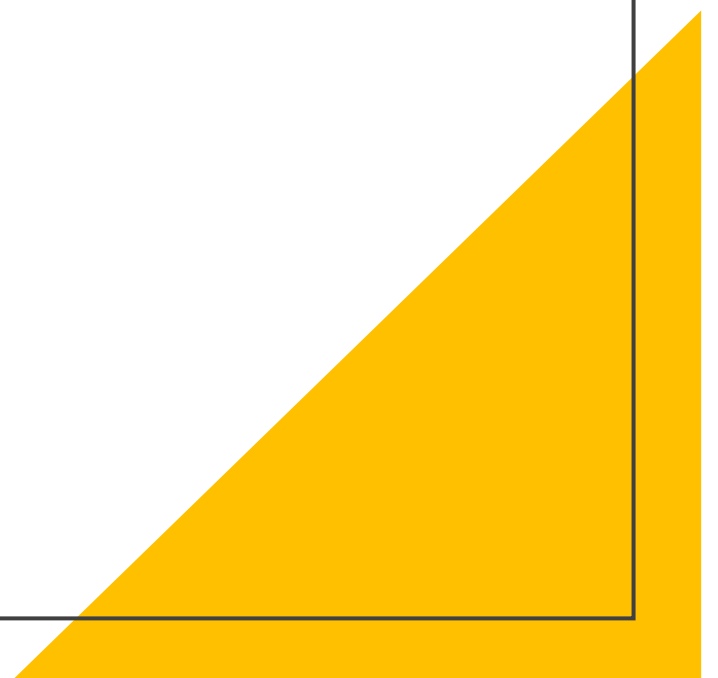

 - Least expensive
 - meets most all voice requirements
 - wireless
 - Used widely

Camera Summary

- PTZ Conference room Camera
 - Least expensive
 - Great solution
 - Will need USB extension and possibly a cart

- TONGVE camera
 - Mid price
 - Great camera features (20x Zoom)
 - Good for large spaces

- Yealink A/V Conference room camera
 - Most expensive
 - Great solution – It actually could solve both the mic and camera issue – Voice distance unknown
 - 133 deg field of view – best in class
 - Great for wide space
 - Facial tracking of camera, zooms to speaker

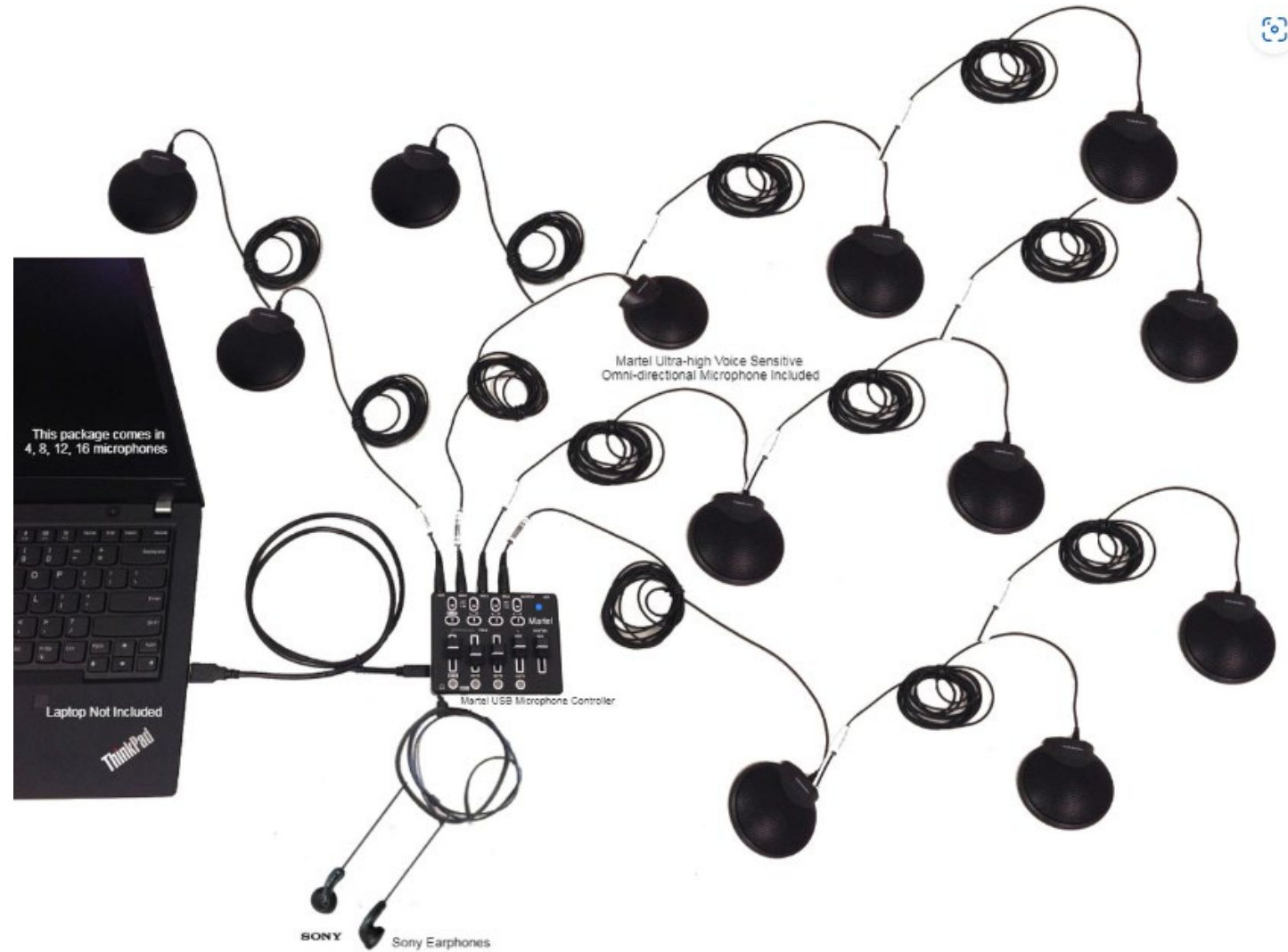

Conclusion

- Any of these items can be combined together to achieve the same outcome (Quality will be a factor)
- The highest cost combination(laptop, mics, camera) will be about \$2500 w/ taxes and additional hardware
- The lowest cost combination(laptop, mics, camera) will be about \$1000 w/ taxes and additional hardware (The lower the cost, the lower the quality)
- The ZOOM app itself will be \$149.90 per year
- There are cheaper solutions but they will not improve the sound or video quality and come with additional issues
